Terms and Conditions

Membership is effective for a period of 12 months from the date of joining.

If the Member chooses not to renew after the first 12 months, there is no commitment to remain a member.

The 12 month membership fee will not be subject to any additional requests for payment in relation to the keeping and training of the horse(s).

If for any reason a Member wishes to withdraw from membership or otherwise ceases to be a Member of the Club part way through any 12 month period such Member shall have no entitlement to any reimbursement of any part of the 12 month membership fee.

Any prize money won by the horse(s) during the period of membership, will be distributed equally amongst the Members subject only to deduction of fees and travels costs.

The sum distributed to Members is determined by the total (excl VAT) paid to the Club by Weatherbys less fees and travel costs.

Membership gives the opportunity to follow the horse(s) run in the Club's name and is for entertainment. It is not an investment opportunity.

In view of the unpredictable nature of the industry, no specific guarantees can be made in any respect.

All decisions relating to the management (including but not limited to entries and declarations to run) of the horse(s) shall be made by the trainer.

Members must be aged 18 or over.

At no time does the Member have a legal or equitable interest in any horse(s) trained on behalf of the Club or running in the name of the Club.

Membership is for personal use only and cannot be used for commercial purposes.

Membership is personal to the Member and cannot be gifted, bequeathed, sold, leased, loaned nor otherwise transferred, nor offered as security to any third party.

Any person banned and/or warned off by the BHA cannot be a Member and any person banned and/or warned off by the BHA during the course of any 12 month period of membership shall immediately cease to be a Member.

The Club reserves the right to amend these Terms and Conditions at any time.
